



Cycling

Cycling is a very popular activity in Hong Kong. There are many places in Hong Kong for us to go cycling.

Many people like going cycling at weekends. However, most of the cycling routes are far away from the city centre, like the one running from Tai Wai to Tai Mei Tuk. It is 20 km long and is the longest 5 cycling route in Hong Kong. It is not easy to carry your bicycle all the way there. To save this trouble, you can rent bicycles from the bicycle shops instead. It costs you less than one hundred dollars to rent them for a day.

It is important to know how to ride safely first. Before you ride on a 10 bicycle, check the brakes. Do some warm-up exercise to avoid injuries. When you cycle, wear a helmet and always ride on the cycle track. Ring the bell when someone is in front of you. Never ride on pedestrian streets, get off and push your bicycle instead.


