We use modals to say if something is possible to be done, to ask for permission or to say if it is necessary to do something.



A frog **can** swim. It **can** hop. It **cannot** fly.



May I walk to school with you? Yes, you may.



The rhino is an endangered animal. We **should** learn to protect it.



We **must** obey the rules.
We **must not** fish here.
